Together, these skills will help ensure every child receives high-quality provision and support for their speech, language and communication needs across their learning journey.

- ★ The ability to liaise effectively with the SENCO, parents, and local SLCN and Speech and Language Therapy (SaLT) services
- ★ Enhanced team management skills, including coaching and mentoring of colleagues to effectively support speech, language and communication skills
- ★ Improved knowledge to understand and identify SLCN, and to implement effective support strategies
- ★ The confidence and skills to make data-driven decisions including monitoring and evaluation of activities and interventions for pupils with SLCN
- ★ The confidence to support/lead referrals to SaLT and SLCN services for diagnostic and clinical assessments and advice
- ★ The nationally-recognised Higher Level Communications Practitioner award from OCN London

Eligibility

To be eligible, you will need to:

- Have experience working in an educational setting. This could be as a Teaching Assistant, Learning Support Assistant (LSA) or equivalent role for at least a year (full-time equivalent)
- Hold **Elklan's Level 3 qualification in Speech and Language Support for 5-11s or 11-16s, or NCFE CACHE Level 3 Award in Supporting Children and Young People's Speech, Language and Communication**. Don't have this qualification? You might like to consider the Language and Literacy specialism of our [Level 5 Specialist Teaching Assistant programme](#), which includes the Level 3 Elklan qualification.
- Declare you have achieved a minimum of GCSE English at Grade 4 (Grade C) or above, or hold an equivalent Level 2 Functional Skills qualification
- Have support from your Headteacher/line manager and SENCO
- Be employed at least 16 hours a week and spend at least 50% of your working hours in England over the duration of the apprenticeship
- Have lived in England for the last three years and have the right to work in the UK
